Instead of only one group, subgroup, or culture how things are going, pluralism recognizes a larger number of competing interest groups that share power. Pluralism is a model of democracy where different groups can express their opinions and ideas. Expand your knowledge by studying some examples of pluralistic democracy, as well as other examples of pluralism. an example of political pluralism Simply put, pluralism exists when several political groups seek to influence policies, practices and other factors affecting everyday life. A pluralistic company or organization involve employees or members in making decisions, rather than management dictating all decisions. A pluralistic democracy is one where democratic elections and separation of powers are held, so that no person or political party has too much control. A pluralistic society is where people do not have to give up their cultural background and define themselves to be part of a group. There are many examples of pluralism in everyday life in places and organizations around the world. Countries that accept immigrants are often referred to as the melting pot, where people from different cultural backgrounds have started to live but are able to keep their cultural traditions alive. Many cities in the United States have areas called Little Italy or Chinatown, where people from these countries keep their cultural traditions. JoAnne's parents are from Lebanon, and although JoAnne has grown up in the United States, she embraces her Lebanese roots. He has lived in Lebanon and often cooks traditional Lebanese dishes. Born and raised in Mexico, Flor came to the United States as a teenager. He was eager to learn English and adapt to the culture around him, but he also continued to celebrate the traditions he grew up with and passed them on to his children. Olga's family came to the United States from Czechoslovakia, and although she and her siblings learned English at school, they kept their mother tongue at home. India has the majority of Hindu and Hindu-speaking people, but there are people from other backgrounds, religions and languages. Teresa grew up in China, but came to New York as a child. It's important for him that his son learns about his legacy, so he goes to a Chinese school every Saturday. Not all cultural groups in a specific country or other geographical location moved there from another country. There are many subcultures in a pluralistic society, each with its own beliefs and practices. The Amish people live next to those who are not Amish but travel with horse and buggy, have no electricity and have set up shops, schools and other organisations used by members of the Amish community. Native American tribes are separate governments, religions, schools and communities where they practice and live in their traditions and history. Because it's so close to the Mexican border, Tucson exhibits many influences on Mexican culture, though it's not a pluralistic society where people from different backgrounds (religion, box, culture, language, ethnicity) live side by side. The city of Bethlehem in the Middle East is showing pluralism when families of Christian, Muslim and Jewish faiths want to live peacefully in the midst of fighting around them. Historically, when one country occupied another, a pluralistic society developed when people spread the country allowed to continue their traditions with the traditions and customs of the occupying state. Some countries are the act of activist, which means that citizens do not have religious freedom. However, in countries where the government is not allowed to establish official religions that are so pluralistic in democracy, there is no dominant religious belief. In a pluralistic democracy without religion, people have the freedom to practice any religion they want or to decide not to practice religion at all. New religions can be formed and practiced. Couples of different faiths may choose to celebrate the customs of both religions. In ancient Rome, many gods were worshipped by many and left to their own believables if they were not considered a threat to the Roman rulers. When Britain occupied India, both British Christian and Indian Hindu traditions were practiced side by side. In the United States, many religions and creeds are practiced side by side in religions, with each group allowed to express their concerns and thoughts. Decisions taken in accordance with the principles of democracy are pluralistic in nature, including by adopting new laws or amending existing legislation. Before the law is passed in a country with democracy, different groups have the opportunity to speak up for their position and lobby. It's an exercise in pluralism. Although legislators have been elected in the United States, there are limits they can change without a popular vote.
