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Writing task 1 table sample answer

There are 5 steps for writing an IELTS table essay: 1) Analyzing the question 2) Identify the main functions 3) Write an introduction 4) Write a review 5) Write the details paragraphs that I want to start by emphasizing the importance of steps 1 and 2. It is important to learn how to make this planning stage right if you hope to write a high-scoring essay. Many students are reluctant to spend time on the first two steps as they want to use as many of the 20 minutes allowed for the essay as much as possible writing rather than planning. However, it is important to do them as they are the key to getting high marks for your essay on the IELTS table. In this lesson, we will go through the 5 stages step by step, answering a practical question. Before we begin, here is an example essay structure that you can use as a guide to all IELTS Academic Task 1 issues. Ideally, your essay should have 4 paragraphs: Paragraph 1 – Introduction Paragraph 2 – Overview Paragraph 3 – 1th main feature Paragraph 4 – 2nd main function Now we have everything we need to start planning and writing our IELTS table essay. Here is our practical question: The tables below give the distribution of the world's population in 1950 and 2000, with an assessment of the situation in 2050. Write at least 150 words. Step 1 – Analyze the question The format of each question of academic task 1 is the same, with the sentence with instructions (highlighted below) identical in each question. Here's our question about practice again. The tables below give the distribution of the world population in 1950 and 2000, assessing the situation in 2050. Each question consists of: sentence 1 – Brief description of the graph Spis 2 – Instructions View graphics, graph, table, etc. Sentence 2 tells you what you need to do. You need to do 3 things: 1. Select the basic functions. 2. Write about the main features. 3. Compare the main features. All three tasks relate to the main features of the graph. You don't have to write about everything. Just choose 2 or 3 key features and you'll have a lot to write about. Step 2 – Identify basic features Some students find questions in the IELTS table more difficult to interpret than other types of graphics, since they are just a set of numbers without visual representation. However, they are not as complex as they can look at first glance. Remember that the IELTS exam is designed to test your language skills, not your math skills. All you're looking for are the main features. However, this can be challenging as tables usually contain information, making it difficult to select the key characteristics. Use the information in the graph to help you identify them. Here are some useful questions to ask? What are the units of the are the deadlines? What can you learn from the title and all labels? What is the most obvious trend? Are there any striking similarities? (I give more details on how to use these questions, plus download lists to identify the main features of all 7 different types of IELTS questions for academic writing task 1, in the tutorial How to find out Analysis task 1 questions.) What information is contained in this graph? Here's the IELTS table again. The key to understanding is to use the instructions given in the title, row and column headings, and units of measurement. For example, the title of the table shows us that it shows the changes in the world population from 1950 to the planned levels in 2050, the world is divided into regions (Africa, Asia, etc.) and the data are given for three specific years – 1950, 2000 and forecast data for 2050. It's a clue that we're going to have to use past, present and future in essays. In the first table, the units of measurement are billions of people, and in the second table, percentages of the total world population are used. Do not look in detail at the numbers at this stage. Instead, it focuses on general trends. What are the most significant changes to the data between 1950 and the 2050 estimates? There are several different features that we can choose from this IELTS table. Here are the three I chose: Basic Heading 1: The only region where the rate is expected to increase by 2050 is Africa. Key feature 2: Europe is expected to have the largest decline in percentage contribution by 2050. The key features you choose will be the starting point for your essay. You will then add more details later. However, with only 20 minutes allowed for task 1, and a requirement of only 150 words, you will not be able to include many details. We're ready to start writing our essay. Here is a reminder of the structure of the 4th part that we will use. Paragraph 1 – Introduction Paragraph 2 – Review Paragraph 3 - 1th main feature Paragraph 4 - second main feature Step 3 - Write introduction In the introduction, you should simply paraphrase the question, i.e. say the same differently. You can do this by using synonyms and changing the sentence structure. For example: The table below gives the distribution of the world population in 1950 and 2000, with an assessment of the situation in 2050 Introduction (paragraph 1): The table compares changes in global population distribution between the six key regions from 1950 to 2000 with the 2050 projections. Step 4 – Write Review (paragraph 2) In the second paragraph, you need to report the main functions you can see in the table by giving only general information. The details come later in the essay. Need make clear comparisons that you have noticed. Here's the characteristics that we have chosen above. Key feature 1: The only region where the rate is expected to increase by 2050 is Africa. Key feature 2: Europe is expected to have the largest decline in percentage contribution by 2050. Now form these ideas in two or three sentences with a total of about 40 words. Specify the information simply using synonyms whenever possible. Complex vocabulary or grammatical structures, only appropriate words and correct verb narrows are not needed. For example: Overview (paragraph 2): The only region where the percentage participation is expected to increase by 2050 is Africa, while Europe is expected to have the largest drop in its proportional ratio in the same time period. The only continent showing fluctuations in rates over the centenary period is Asia. Step 5 – Write the 1th detailed paragraph Paragraphs 3 and 4 of essays on the IELTS table where you include more detailed information about the data in the graph. In paragraph 3, you must provide evidence to support your first 1 or 2 main characteristics. Be sure to make comparisons where appropriate. Here are the first two: Key feature 1: The only region where the rate is expected to increase by 2050 is Africa. Key feature 2: Europe is expected to have the largest drop in percentage contribution by 2050, which in 1950 is 22 % and is expected to continue to decline steadily to reach only 7 % in 2050. Main feature 3: The only region showing fluctuations in percentage contribution over the entire time period is Asia. Here is an example of which you could write: Paragraph 4: Another notable trend can be seen in the data for Asia, which is the only region that shows an increase in the contribution share in the first fifty years, but the prediction of a decline, albeit a small one, with an expectation that by 2050 the rest of the regions, North America, Latin America and Oceania, make up less than 10% of the world's total population and show only slight fluctuations in their contribution throughout the time period. It is best to mention all the regions, if at all possible, but you can get away with the missing last sentence if you really insist on time. Here are the four paragraphs put together to create our completed essay. Completed IELTS table table essay this example table table IELTS is well above the minimum word limit so that see that you don't have room to include a lot of details at all. It is therefore essential to select only a few key to write about. Now use what you have learned in this lesson to practice answering other questions in the IELTS table.
